Three trees to the hundred feet, is the minimum spacing desirable. A distance of forty feet between trees is better. Close planting produces so much shade along the streets, that it is impossible to grow any satisfactory kind of turf in the parking strip. They should be staggered on opposite sides of the street. Parking Strips--The parking strips for trees should not be too narrow. Many trees develop trunks thirty-six inches and more in diameter, and the surface root systems spread out to at least double this distance. For proper ultimate growth, a width of six feet is not too much for the parking strip. Lesser widths force the sidewalks and curbs out of place. Trees will die if...
